As I think back over the years about that which had the greatest influences on my faith in Jesus Christ, I think often of the little Sunday school in the little rural church to which my family belonged. There were many influences on my faith. The greatest of which were, of course, my parents. But there were also others: my confirmation pastor, a college professor, an Air Force chaplain, a hospital chaplain, a seminary professor, all among others. But, I fondly remember the Sunday school.

I suppose the first thing I remember about it was that attending was never optional. That, of course, had more to do with my parents and not so much with the Sunday school itself. We never, ever missed a Sunday, unless it was due to sickness or being away for the week-end. (We were dairy farmer and the cows had to be milked twice a day, so you can guess how often that was.) I was in a class that usually had about four members. If everyone was there we might have six in the class. So, we knew each other very well although the six of us came from five different school districts (we were a very rural congregation). I also remember the teachers. They were neighbors, friends, and maybe relatives. I remember how important the faith was to them and how that showed through in all that they taught. I also remember how what they taught us on Sunday morning either did or did not show through their lives the rest of the week. If they did not live the faith that they taught, that was very apparent in that community. But, mostly, by far, what they taught us on Sunday morning was very much their life the rest of the week. That witness so much helped to shape my faith. Almost all of them are now of blessed memory, yet their witness continues on in the faith of the students they taught. I also remember learning the Bible stories. Back then we had bound hardcover books that were used year after year after year. There was not a new curriculum every year or every few years. That congregation could never have afforded that. So, my younger sister and brothers used the same books that I had used. What we learned were the Bible stories. I learned the Bible in Sunday school. I learned about Jesus. Quite often we learned the same Bible stories year after year, although the level of teaching and understanding was raised every year. We were taught to put the Bible story in the context of our daily life. I was also one of the students whose family life was a witness to what I learned in Sunday school. There are several other things I remember about Sunday school. We did not have "art" projects, it was much like a school classroom, and it was never expected that I would be entertained. It might have been nice to have done a few of those projects. We sang some songs that in their very simple way still influence me like "Jesus Loves Me," "The B-I-B-L-E," "Jesus Loves the Little Children, All the Children of the World", among others. Again, in their very simple way, they taught us truth. The Bible stories, the teachers, and the songs all taught us about Jesus.

I know that it is very difficult to find time to teach the Bible stories at home. We are truly too busy. When our children started having our grandchildren we purchased the "Arch book" series for them, so they would have a resource for teaching the Bible stories to our grandchildren. In the midst of the busyness of our lives it is still difficult to use these on a regular basis. So, the upshot of all this is: bring your children to Sunday school. Give them the opportunity to learn the Bible stories and that: "Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so."

Please see the bulletin board to sign-up to help. All donations are needed by Wednesday, November 14.


4th Sunday Offering
