My brothers and sisters in Christ,

First off, I want to share if you hadn't already heard that Kate and I are expecting baby #2. She or he will arrive in April 2017. When we told Ellie she was going to be a big sister, she immediately threw her water cup on the ground. Now, there are multiple ways to interpret that reaction; however, Kate and I decided to interpret Ellie's reaction as excitement for our new addition. Our family is thankful for all your support, love and prayers!

Before I transition into my monthly reflection, I want to briefly explain our exciting 4-week Stewardship Program coming in October, entitled "Living Each Day as a Steward." During the first four Sundays of October, we will intentionally look at Scripture through the lens of Stewardship. Our hope is that all of us will claim and learn to be better stewards with our time, talents and treasure through: recognizing, thanking, encouraging, growing, giving, telling and praying. Our Stewardship Program Kick-off is Sunday, October 2, and we will conclude our Stewardship Program on Sunday, October 23, for Celebration Sunday!

For my monthly reflection, I have been thinking a lot about the difference between *serving and volunteering*. This differentiation was brought to light at last month's Spiritual Renewal Retreat. For those who weren't present, we had a spiritual director from Prairiewoods, Rodney Bluml, join us to facilitate conversation and teach us various spiritual practices. During the conversation, Rodney pointed out the difference between volunteering and serving. At first, his separating the two seemed like an insignificant play on words. However, the more I reflected, the more I realized how important it is that we, as disciples of Christ, understood the tremendous difference between service and volunteering.

We, at Holy Redeemer, want to empower and equip disciples who serve—not volunteer. Now, volunteering isn't bad. People volunteer to create positive change. People volunteer to help people. But, volunteering has time constraints. When we volunteer, it's often done in our free time and so we can only designate a specific amount of time (i.e. 1 to 2 hours a week). The other issue with volunteering is it often is done out of obligation and as a result will lead to burnout, which is why many non-profits experience lots of volunteer turn-over.

We want to be different at Holy Redeemer. We want people who give cheerfully. We want people who love fully. We want people who serve joyfully. Serving like volunteering is about creating change and helping people. Yet, the difference is service has no constraints. It's who we are as baptized members of the Body of Christ. Service isn't done out of obligation. Service, instead, is done out of our response to God's grace and love. Centered and grounded in our relationship with Christ, we then go out and serve the neighbor.

"The thief comes only to steal, kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." –John 10:10

Jesus called us to live our lives abundantly. I pray we, at Holy Redeemer, are a congregation of "Abundant Joyfuls." That we are a congregation full of disciples energized to serve and live out the love of Christ. And who do so joyfully in response to the abundance we have received from God.

Thank you for all you do in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus!

Who benefits from Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry benefits both care givers (Stephen Ministers) and care receivers. The Stephen Ministers grow greatly as they learn about helping others. They learn about themselves. As hurting people in our congregation and community grow stronger through this caring ministry, the whole Church is built up and made stronger. We all can have the confident knowledge that when pains of life come our way, someone (not just the pastor) will always be there, ready to care for us, to bring God's love to us in a personal way.
