My brothers and sisters in Christ,

On May 15, we will celebrate the day of Pentecost, which is the day we remember Jesus sending the Holy Spirit into our world. On that day we will stand witness to two of our youth (Matthew & Jackson) confirming their faith. What a day it will be! While I'm so glad all of you will stand in support of these two incredible youth, I believe the day of Pentecost is a day for all of us to think about our faith and relationship with God.

Ask yourself, how often do you think about the importance of faith in your life? How often do you return to your baptismal promises? How often do you think about how you are living out your faith in your life? The reality is, most of us struggle to find time and space for God in our busy lives full of schedules, demands and activities. I preach often on this phenomenon, but it's because I think it's a reality for many of us.

During Confirmation this year, one of the biggest focuses was on the students not being afraid to ask the big questions. Conrad and I stressed that doubt and questions are a part of faith. We taught that there is no wrong way to pray and that there is no cookie-cutter model to being a disciple of Christ. The truth is all of us are different and all of us are broken. But, I believe God loves that we are different. He created us to be diverse. God doesn't see us as broken; He sees us as beautiful. Each of us is beautiful and loved by God. Those are the promises that Jackson & Matthew will confirm on May 15. They are the same promises God made to you in your baptism.

**“Jesus said, ‘For the Father Himself loves you, because you have loved me and believed I came from the Father. I came from the Father and I am going to the Father...The hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each one to your home. Yet I am not alone because the Father is with me. I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution. But take courage for I have conquered the world!’” –John 16: 27-33**

God didn't call you to be me. He called you to be you. To be your authentic self. To have your life centered in Christ and live out the gifts, skills and talents God has blessed you with.

This month, I pray you wonder what God is up to in your life. I pray you question what God is up to in your church and in your community. I pray you become attentive to the TRUTH that Jesus is alive and active!

During worship this past month, we have been singing the contemporary song, “*Because He Lives*,” by Matthew Maher. The lyrics speak perfectly to the truth of Easter that because Christ is alive, we are alive. This month, we will be singing a new song entitled, “*If We are the Body*,” by Casting Crowns. My hope is the lyrics inspire all of us to wonder how we are being the Church in the world. Additionally, I pray it encourages us all to question how we are living out our faith as the Body of Christ in our community.

Thank you for all you do in the name of our Risen Lord, Jesus!
