We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose. For those who He foreknew He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, (Romans 8:28-29a). I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God; which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of Your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect (Romans 12:1-2).

It is God's will that we live a holy life conformed to that of His Son, Jesus Christ. This is God redeeming work through His Son, Jesus Christ. From what does God redeem through the costly death of His Son on the cross? He redeems us from our sin, from our penchant for making of ourselves our own god, from worshiping the creation instead of the Creator. He redeems us from our separating ourselves from Him. He redeems us from our constantly seeking and doing our own will. He redeems us from all that which leads to death. We come to worship each week to hear the good news of the promise that He declared to us in our Holy Baptism: "I am your God; you are Mine." That promise means life for us. We, though, when not constantly reminded of this promise, forget this promise. We forget who we are and whose we are. We begin to think, believe, and act as if we are our own god. We worship every week so that we can hear this promise again declared into our ears and into our hearts. We worship every week so that we can once again taste, smell and hold this promise as we receive the bread and wine, the body and blood of Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of our sins. As we hear and receive we are once again made new and holy. The "old you" dies and the "new you" is raised to new life. God restores the relationship and God offers the believer in Christ through the Holy Spirit the possibility of leading a new life that is obedient to Him and responsive to the needs of our neighbor.

For St. Paul, faith is not the belief of some factual statements, but rather faith is obedience to the will of God, the God who has redeemed us. Again, from Donfried, In the first place, we must recognize that the gift given in justification does not have automatic consequences, i.e., some kind of lifetime immunization or guarantee. Rather, it remains a gift only as long as the will is received with daily fidelity and obedience to Christ. Never to be overlooked is the fact that the believer participates in but does not thereby possess the righteousness of God. Justification is both gift and responsibility. The responsibility is to live a holy life. We might ask whether or not our life looks like a life conformed to Christ or to the world, what Holy Scripture says or what the world says. What life does our neighbor see? Does our neighbor see one whose life is that of a forgiven sinner who seeks, and often fails, to live a life that is holy, obedient to Christ and the will of God? Are we enough familiar with the Holy Scriptures to know God's will and what the Holy Spirit is doing to conform us to Christ. Are we obedient to the commandment to keep the Sabbath Day holy so that we hear God's promise proclaimed to us and receive the body and blood of Christ, so that the Holy Spirit may transform us into God's holy people? It is quite common to think today that doing good things make us a good person. Not so! Rather, as Martin Luther reminds us, Good works do not make a good person, but a good person does good works. A holy life is a life that is redeemed to do good works; it is not a life of good works whereby we hope that we may redeem ourselves. A good person is made only by God as He redeems us from sin to live a holy life.


Thank you for donating to the quarter bank. We took in \$330 in quarters. The quarter bank is still there waiting for more quarters to help with next year's event.

For August, our General Fund income was \$3,523 below budget. Through August, YTD General Fund Income was \$17,871 below budget.

Our August General Fund Expenses were \$4,594 below budget. Through August, YTD General Fund Expenses were \$43,002 below budget. (This includes all budgeted accounts for the year, previous months did not)

For August, our Building Addition Income was \$548 below budget. Through August, YTD Building Addition Income was \$5,469 below budget.

\$1,085 was moved from the General Fund to the Contingency Fund since our August income was higher than our expenses.

Our Contingency Balance at the end of August was \$51,084.65.

Our Mortgage Loan balance at the end of August was \$417,082.01.

Food Bank Offering was \$319.

4th Sunday Offering for Take Away Hunger was \$570.



### **An Invitation to Holy Redeemer Members**

Dear Friends in Christ,

Stephen Ministry continues to develop here at Holy Redeemer. Already there is evidence that this ministry is multiplying one of our strengths, as a congregation...Christ caring for people through people. Five people are currently receiving care from a Stephen Minister.

The next step involves prayerfully identifying men & women at Holy Redeemer who are willing to answer God's call to serve as a Stephen Minister. Then there will be 50 hours of enriching & practical training in Christian caring skills. This training is distinctively Christian & focuses on God as the One Who cures as we care.

We are planning the next training for January through May 2019. Once training is completed, Holy Redeemer's newest Stephen Ministers will be commissioned and begin meeting confidentially every week with their care receivers. Twice a month they will also be meeting for continuing education and peer group supervision. Although Stephen Ministers commit to serve for at least 2 years, many choose to continue beyond that time.

While being a Stephen Minister requires commitment, it also brings joy & fulfillment. We believe this ministry will help any individual grow in faith. As a Stephen Minister, you will have the opportunity to use the skills learned not only in your care-giving relationship, but also in your everyday relationships. We trust that when God calls a person to a certain role, God also gives the faith, gifts & skills needed to do His will.

We invite you to pray & reflect about becoming a Stephen Minister. If you decide to pursue a call of becoming a Stephen Minister, please contact us right away. We will be happy to answer your questions & talk to you about how to get started.

We look forward to seeing whatever God might do in the lives of those who give care, those who receive care, & in the life of Holy Redeemer as a congregation through our participation in Stephen Ministry.

# **Transformed by**Grace, Faith and Love

The theme for this year's stewardship emphasis is *Transformed by Grace, Faith, and Love*. We will begin this emphasis on Sunday, October 7<sup>th</sup>. As God's people, we have been given the high honor of being his stewards. As his stewards, we are called to manage faithfully all that we've been entrusted with according to God's will and benefit. Because of God's generous gifts of grace, faith, and love, we can accomplish all that God asks us to do. God works in and through us as we become his hands, feet, and mouth. Each week during this three-week emphasis, we will be focusing on one of the three virtues, grace, faith, and love.

In week one, our focus is on God's undeserved kindness and love which the Bible calls grace. God's grace comes from God through Jesus and his work for us. It is not something we have a right to. Jesus obtained it for us. We get it freely because of the obedience and sacrifice of Jesus. This saving grace also enables and motivates us to be God's stewards. The power of God's grace in our lives compels us to use our time, talents, and money in ways that glorify God.

In week two, we are reminded that it is through faith that we have access into God's grace and a new relationship with him. Through faith, God changes us, and we are born anew of him. Not only does faith justify us and give us peace with God (Romans 5:1), we are told by James and other writers that faith produces works (James 2:18). Faith leads to action. Through faith, we are empowered to fulfill God's purposes. Our deeds as stewards are evidence of our faith.

The third week we will focus on the virtue of love. Love ought to follow faith. Love seeks the welfare of others. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and

his love is perfected in us" (1 John 4:11-12). God's love in Christ will compel us to do things that appear foolish to unbelievers. God's love prompts us to give freely of our time, talents, and treasures to help others and extend his kingdom.

I hope and pray that God will use the sermon messages on *Transformed by Grace*, *Faith*, *and Love* to draw you closer to him. I also urge you to make every effort to attend the Bible studies as we focus on grace, faith, and love.
