Stewardship

Sisters & Brothers in Christ,

This past month, two exciting things happened at Holy Redeemer: Intentional Conversations and Stephen Ministry Training. I believe both the conversations and the training will bring life and energy to our congregation not only in the short term but also for us going forward in the long term.

I want to start out recapping our Intentional Conversations. To do that, I first have to thank Jesse Myers who helped organize the surveys and facilitated the dialogue. I also want to thank all of you who stayed after worship and joined us for these conversations. The conversations were truly enlightening and fruitful. For those not able to attend, we engaged in intentional

conversations around several key topics which include: *Open Table, All are Welcome, All are God's Children,* and *Priesthood of All Believers*. So often we use phrases such as these in church and your 2017 council felt it was important to unpack these topics together. We wanted to hear from you about what you thought these meant and how they call us to live as people and as a church in our world. The hope is that we, at Holy Redeemer, are always trying to create safe spaces where diverse ideas and conversations such as these can take place.

The second thing I want to highlight is Stephen Ministry. Again, I must start out by thanking Marti Marz. Give her a huge hug for dealing with me for an entire week. She is a saint! In July, Marti Marz and I spent a week down in Dallas, TX, for Stephen Ministry Leader Training. I must admit the best part was enjoying a meal without interruption, sleeping through the night and being able to watch ESPN instead of Beauty and the Beast for the 77th time. Marti and I both got to meet some incredible people from all over the country. Each day, we were taught a whirlwind of information and we left with tons of great tips, learnings and insights. We actually came home with 30 pounds worth of training materials. Yes, 30 pounds! You can actually weigh how much we learned. Marti and I cannot wait to share all we learned with you all. We both believe this is something that is going to add to our congregation and help equip more people to engage in ministry within our church. If you are interested in hearing more about it, talk to either Marti or I.

"Now during those days, when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of food. And the 12 apostles called together the whole community and said, 'It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables. Therefore, friends, select from among yourselves seven people of good standing, full of Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word.' What they said pleased the community and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus. They had these people stand before the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them." –Acts 6: 1-6

Stephen Ministry isn't a program. It's a ministry based in Scripture. When the Christian Church was first founded, Scripture tells us that the apostles weren't able to keep up with everything. Instead of trying to do it all, the disciples followed the example of Jesus. Jesus didn't do it all. He appointed, equipped and empowered disciples to join in mission together. The apostles did the same thing. They had Stephen and six other disciples step forward to care for the needs of the community. Once the seven disciples were appointed as caregivers, the apostles didn't stop doing ministry. They continued to proclaim the Gospel and spread the Good News. The difference was they saw God's work was bigger than them and so they invited others to share in God's work together. We hope to do the same at Holy Redeemer. Through Stephen Ministry, we hope to equip and empower saints from HRLC to join with us in caring for others in our midst.

The motto of Stephen Ministry is "Christ caring for people through people." Notice, it's not Christ caring for people through pastors. It's Christ caring for people *through people*. You are the people. Together, we embody Christ and join in God's work to care for the needs in our church and in our community.

Thank you for all you do in the name of our Risen Lord!

The Grateful Grannies was started in 2003. The Grateful Grannies goal is to provide a joyful Christmas to homeless and in-need children and their families. Names of children and families are provided by school counselors from area schools. The school counselors know that Grateful Grannies are also available to help all-year round when there's a real need.

Take Away Hunger

Take Away Hunger is an international food relief organization working to save the lives of starving people around the globe. Join us as we honor "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday, September 10, by packaging food for Take Away Hunger. We would like to have 4 teams of 12 people. Our youth will make up one team. Each team will package approximately 1,728 meals in about 45 minutes to an hour at a cost of 25 cents per meal. We will package a specialized rice based soy casserole mixture which will be sent overseas.

We need to raise approximately \$2,000. We have applied for a grant from HRLC's endowment fund plus several members have applied for funds from Thrivent. We've also received an anonymous donation of \$500.

We will have the packaging party after church on Sept.10. We need 54 volunteers. Sign-up sheets are on the bulletin board. YOUR help is needed. Please join us. A potluck will follow.

It is open to all – from children to adults and we will meet again on August 17.


The fun starts at 5:00 p.m. and you can eat at Wild Hogs if you don't want to cook at home. Stay as long as you want.

- For June, our General Fund income was \$1,160 above budget.

- \$2,670 was moved from General Fund to the General Fund since our May income was more than our May expenses. The balance of our Contingency Fund is \$52,221. In July, a Principal only payment will be paid in the amount of \$2,221 to reduce our Contingency balance to \$50,000.
- Food Bank Offering was \$227.
- 4th Sunday Offering for St. Luke's Hospital Ronald McDonald House was \$168.
